POLICY PROVISIONS

1. Student Involvement

The College has in place *Conditions of Enrolment* document that sets out the conditions of enrolment at the College. It is a standard condition of enrolment that every boy is to be fully and actively involved in Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities.

The co-curricular and extra-curricular activities beyond the ordinary hours of school are a necessary part of the College's programme. Students are enrolled on the understanding that they join in sports, retreats, class camps, excursions and similar activities.

Students who have the ability and physical fitness and are chosen to represent the College in sport will do so willingly, enthusiastically and conscientiously as a way of building up College Spirit. Commitment to College sport, Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities has a priority over all other activities such as outside tutorials, part-time work commitments and outside club commitments.

Students who are not selected in their preferred area/s of involvement will be directed to other Cocurricular activities in order to fulfil their commitments.

2. Staff Involvement

All teaching staff are employed on the understanding they are expected to assist and participate in the College's Co-curricular and Extra-curricular Programme. Staff will be remunerated for their involvement in the Co-curricular Programme.

These are activities which include substantial preparations, outside the timetabled school day and extend over a period of at least six (6) weeks. They carry expectations in terms of number of hours of training/practice with students outside the timetabled school day. Training of teams, and presence at weekend sporting fixtures as well as attendance at debating and performing arts training/rehearsals and performance/competition events all fall within these expectations.

Teaching staff will be provided opportunities to gain suitable coaching qualifications and will be remunerated accordingly.

Teaching staff agree to abide by the College's and ISA's Code of Conduct whilst participating in the Co-curricular Programme.

2.1. On-going contractual obligations

Co-curricular involvement is to be **at least** the equivalent to the winter sports commitment per Cocurricular year. Whilst personal preferences and qualifications will be taken into account, the Principal, having regard to the needs of the College and in particular its students, reserves the right to assign specific Co-curricular activities.

2.2. Mandatory Requirements

Teaching staff engaged by the College to coach/tutor within the Co-curricular Programme must have a current verified Working With Children Reference Number which the College will keep on file. They must also agree to abide by the College's and ISA's Code of Conduct that will be provided to the coach/tutor prior to the commencement of the relevant Co-curricular activity.

3. Parent/Caregiver and Outside Coaches Involvement

Parents/Caregivers and outside coaches are encouraged to support, coach, assist and participate in the College's Co-curricular Programme.

The coaching/tutoring of Co-curricular activities attracts an allowance/remuneration.

3.1. Mandatory Requirements

Parents/Caregivers and outside coaches engaged by the College to coach/tutor within the Cocurricular Programme must have a current verified Working With Children Reference Number which the College will keep on file. They must also agree to abide by the College's and ISA's Code of Conduct that will be provided to the coach/tutor prior to the commencement of the relevant Cocurricular activity.

PROCEDURES

4. Outline

4.1. Students

- The College encourages students to participate in activities for which they show an interest and/or proficiency.
- Students are expected to participate in those activities for which they nominate and are
 required to attend the necessary training/practice sessions. They are expected to represent
 the College in sports and activities for which they show proficiency and particularly in
 instances where they are involved in sporting/cultural pursuits in bodies external to the
 College.
- A number of activities require students to trial for a limited number of places. Students not selected in a team or squad are to consult the Director of Co-curricular or the Head of Junior School Sport to gain placement in another activity in order to fulfil their Co-curricular commitment.
- Appropriate uniforms and presentation are required at all times.
- Students who nominate to participate in a particular activity are required to undertake complete involvement throughout the programme. In cases of sport, students who nominate to play in a summer season activity are expected to participate in Terms 1 and 4, while those who nominate for winter sport are expected to fulfil obligations throughout Terms 2 and 3.
- Students are not able to change from one activity to another without prior approval given by the Director of Co-curricular.
- If a student is chosen to represent the College and cannot attend the event due to a legitimate reason, an advanced request for leave is required from the parent.
- Breaches of this policy will involve disciplinary sanctions, as determined by the Director of Co-curricular and/or the Principal.

4.2. Staff

- Prospective teaching staff are informed of their Co-curricular obligations at the time of their interview and at the time of their contract signing.
- Teaching staff meet with the Director of Co-curricular or Junior School Head of Sport in order to indicate their areas of preference, experience and qualifications.
- Teaching staff are ordinarily given a minimum of two weeks' notice prior to the commencement of their Co-curricular activity coaching/supervision.
- Heads of Sport and/or MIC's provide them with relevant documentation, including and not limited to the induction package, Coach Guidelines, Risk Management Plans and Group Health Care Plans.

4.3. Outside Coaches/Music Tutors

- Prospective outside Coaches and Tutors meet with the Director of Co-curricular or Heads of Sport or Bandmaster to determine their suitability for a specific role.
- Successful applicants provide Working with Children reference numbers for verification along with their ATO forms and bank details for payment upon completion of their season.
- Outside Coaches and Tutors are ordinarily given a minimum of two weeks' notice prior to the commencement of their Co-curricular activity coaching/supervision.
- Heads of Sport and/or MIC's and/or Bandmaster provide them with relevant documentation, including and not limited to the induction package, Coach Guidelines, Risk Management Plans and Group Health Care Plans.
